

About Training Reimbursement

What is training reimbursement?

The Department of Early Learning (DEL) offers reimbursement for state-approved training costs for professionals currently employed in DEL licensed or certified facilities.

Who can apply for a training reimbursement?

- 1. Eligible job titles are:
 - Family child care home
 - licensee
 - primary worker
 - assistant
 - Child care center
 - director
 - assistant director
 - program supervisor
 - lead teacher
 - assistant or aide
 - School-age program
 - program director
 - program assistant director
 - site coordinator
 - lead staff or group leader
 - assistant
- 2. You must have a confirmed or verified employment record in your MERIT professional record.
- 3. You can apply one time each fiscal year (July 1–June 30).
- 4. Your training must have been completed no more than 12 months prior to submitting your application.
- 5. You may apply for up to \$250 for your training reimbursement.
- 6. Reimbursements are available on a first-come, first-serve basis; funds are limited each fiscal year.

Are all trainings eligible for reimbursement?

- Training must have been provided by a state-approved trainer.
- Health & safety trainings required by licensing (such as CPR, First-Aid, and Food Handler's card, etc.,) are not eligible for reimbursement.
- STARS hours approved through a MERIT Continuing Education Proposal are **not** eligible.
- STARS hours approved through college credit, Clock Hours or CEUs are not eligible.

How do I apply?

- Log into your MERIT account.
- Click on the Applications tab.
- Select Training Reimbursement.
- Follow the steps to complete and submit the application. Your reimbursement will be mailed from our payment vendor, Chaves Consulting, within 2 to 4 weeks.
